1626 – Woman’s sweater in Mayflower Easy Care Classic and Mayflower Kid Silk.

Size:	S	(M)	L	(XL)	XXL	(XXXL)
Chest measurement in cm:	110	(110)	118	(118)	124	(124)

Mayflower Easy Care Classic, Sand, color 250, balls:	10	(10)	11	(11)	12	(12)

Needles:	Circular needles US 9/UK 5 and US 10/UK 4, double pointed needles or magic loop (circular needles 100 cm) US 9/UK 5 and US 10/UK 4.					
Quality:	Mayflower Easy Care Classic. 100 % Pure new wool, ca. 106 m pr. 50 gram. Mayflower Kid Silk. 70 % Kid Mohair, 30 % Silk, ca. 195 m pr. 25 gram.					
Gauge:	14½ sts and 19 r in stockinette with double yarn on needles US 10/UK 4 = 10 x 10 cm					

To get the best result, we recommend using Knit Pro needles, which is the professional tool for knitting and crocheting.

Note: This model is knitted with double yarn – 1 thread of each quality.

Fisherman’s rib sts in garter stitch:

1. rnd: Slip the sts purl wise with yarn over.
2. rnd: Knit the sts and the yarn over together.

Body.

Cast on 164(164)172(172)180(180) sts with double yarn (1 thread of each quality) on circular needles US 9/UK 5 and knit around in ribbing (alternately knit 1 and purl 1). when the edge measures 5 cm, change to circular needles US 10/UK 4. Continue around in stockinette, put a marker at the beginning of the rnd. When the work measures 40(41)42(43)44(45) cm, fasten off for armhole like so on the last rnd: knit from the beginning of the rnd 79(79)83(83)87(87) sts, Fasten off the next 6 sts, knit 76(76)80(80)84(84) sts and fasten off the next 6 sts – meaning 3 sts before and 3 sts after the beginning of the rnd = 76(76)80(80)84(84) sts on respectively the back and front piece. Let the work rest.

Sleeves.

Cast on 48(48)48(52)52(52) sts with double yarn (1 thread of each quality) on short circular needles or magic loop US 9/UK 5 and knit around in ribbing (alternately knit 1 and purl 1). When the edge measures 5 cm, change to circular needles US 10/UK 4. Continue around in stockinette, put a marker at the beginning of the rnd. On the first round increase 12 sts evenly spread = 60(60)60(64)64(64) sts. Continue straight up, until the sleeve measures 44(44)45(45)46 (46) cm and fasten off for armhole on the next rnd like so: knit

57(57)57(61)61(61) sts and fasten off the next 6 sts = 3 sts before and 3 sts after the beginning of the round = 54(54)54(58)58(58) sts. Let the work rest. Knit another sleeve.

Circular yoke.

Put the pieces on circular needles US 10/UK 4, starting with the 54(54)54(58)58(58) sts on the left sleeve, the 76(76)80(80)84(84) sts on the front piece, the 54(54)54(58)58(58) sts on the right sleeve and the 76(76)80(80) 84(84) sts on the back = in total 260(260)268(276)284(284) sts. The beginning of the row is between the back and the left sleeve. Put a marker here. Knit 1 rnd all knit sts, while on size L increase 2 sts evenly spread. On size XL decrease 1 sts. On size XXL and XXXL increase 1 sts = 260(260)270(275)285(285) sts. Now divide the sts like so: from the beginning of the row knit alternately * 1 fisherman’s rib sts in garter stitch and purl 4. Repeat the entire rnd. On the following 10th rnd decrease like so: * 1 fisherman’s rib sts in garter sts, purl 2, purl 2 together, 1 fisherman’s rib sts in garter sts, purl 4, repeat from * the rest of the rnd. Decrease this way in every other purl-rib. On the following 10th rnd decrease like so: * 1 fisherman’s rib sts in garter sts, purl 3, 1 fisherman’s rib sts in garter sts, purl 2, purl 2 together, repeat from *. You have now decreases in all purl-ribs = 208(208)216(220)

228(228) sts and now you knit alternately 1 fisherman's rib sts in garter sts and 3 purl sts. On the following 8th rnd decrease like so: * 1 fisherman's rib sts in garter sts, purl 1, purl 2 together, 1 fisherman's rib sts in garter sts, purl 3, repeat from * the rest of the rnd. This way you decrease in every other purl-rib.

On the following 8th rnd decrease like so: * 1 fisherman's rib sts in garter sts, purl 3, 1 fisherman's rib sts in garter sts, purl 1, purl 2 together, repeat from *. You have now decreased in all purl-ribs = 156(156)162(165)171 (171) sts and now knit alternately 1 fisherman's rib sts in garter sts and 2 purl sts. On the following 6th rnd decrease like so: * 1 fisherman's rib sts in garter sts, purl 2 together, 1 fisherman's rib sts in garter

sts, purl 2, repeat from * the rest of the rnd. This way you decrease in every other purl-rib.

On the following 6th rnd decrease like so: * 1 fisherman's rib sts in garter sts, purl, 1 fisherman's rib sts in garter sts, purl 2 together, repeat from *. You have now decreased in all purl-ribs = 104(104)108(110)114(114) sts and now you knit alternately 1 fisherman's rib sts in garter sts and 1 purl sts.

From the next rnd continue on circular needles US 9/UK 5 in ribbing (alternately knit 1 and purl 1) as the sts appear. Knit 4 rnd ribbing and fasten off loosely in ribbing (you can do this with needles US 10/UK 4) on the next rnd.

Sew the armholes together.

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
